This is Mark's story ...

Mark Rine is a Columbus, Ohio firefighter who is married with five children. Mark was diagnosed with stage four skin cancer, melanoma in 2012. Mark was given a 10% chance of survival beyond five years.

Since Mark's diagnosis, he has been trying to save firefighters from themselves, from getting cancer, from exposing themselves to dangerous carcinogens. Mark has been speaking across the country to thousands of firefighters, fire departments, colleges, network television, city and state officials. Beyond Mark's personal message he hopes to get new cancer laws, better prevention and more funding for protection; but more importantly deliver the message to firefighters to protect themselves in order to protect others.

Mark's story is very informative and really hits home. Mark is one of us and hopes that his personal story helps in our larger journey to make sure that Everybody Goes Home.
